# Quick Guide for ADA



## Curb (cuts) Ramps




- Running slope shall be less than 1:12.
- Cross slope shall be less than 1:48.
- Side slope shall be less than 1:10.
- Counter slope, of adjoining gutters and road surfaces, shall not be greater than 1:20.
- Landings at top shall have a clear length of 36" min. and a width at least as wide as the ramp.
- Ramps shall have detectable warnings consisting of raised truncated domes and shall contrast visually with adjoining surfaces, either light-on-dark or dark-on-light.

## Doorway Guidelines

- Doorways shall have a minimum clear opening of 32" with the door open 90 degrees, measured between the face of the door and the opposite stop.
- Thresholds at doorways shall not exceed 1/2" in height.
- All operating devices on accessible doors shall have a shape that is easy to grasp with one hand and does not require tight grasping, tight pinching, or twisting of the wrist to operate.
- The maximum force for pushing or pulling open a door, other than fire doors, shall be 5 lbf.




# Parking Guidelines



- Vehicle spaces shall be 96" minimum for cars and 132" minimum for vans. Van spaces can be 96" when access aisle is 96" wide.
- Access aisles shall be 60" wide minimum, be the full length of the parking spaces they serve, and be at the same level.
- Accessible spaces must connect to the shortest possible route to the accessible building entrance.
- Signs shall include the Symbol of Accessibility. Signs for van spaces shall contain the designation "Van Accessible". Signs shall be 60" minimum above ground surface from bottom of sign.
- One in every six (6) accessible spaces, but not less than one (1), shall be served by an access aisle 96" wide minimum and shall be designated van accessible.

# Ramp Guidelines

- Any part of an accessible route with a slope greater than 1:20 shall be considered a ramp.
- There shall be level landings at the top and bottom of each ramp run, with the width being as wide as the ramp run and the length 60" minimum.
- Maximum rise in ramp run shall be 30".
- Maximum slope of a ramp in new construction shall be 1:12.
- Cross slope of ramp runs shall not be steeper than 1:48.
- Ramp runs with a rise greater than 6" shall have handrails.
- The minimum width of a ramp shall be 36" minimum clear.
- Surfaces must be stable, firm, and slip resistant.



# Restroom Guidelines

## Water Closets:

- Clear floor space shall be 60" min. perpendicular from side wall and 56" min. perpendicular from rear wall.
- Centerline shall be 16" min. and 18" maximum from side wall.
- Height shall be 17" to 19" measured to the top of the toilet seat.

## Urinals:

- Clear floor space in front shall be 30" x 48" minimum.
- Rim shall be 17" max. A.F.F.
- Minimum depth shall be 13 1/2".

## Lavatories:



- Clear floor space in front shall be 30" x 48" minimum.
- Shall be mounted no higher than 34" A.F.F.
- Shall have hot water and drain pipes insulated or configured to protect against contact.
- Mirrors located above lav shall be 40" maximum.
- Grab bars must be provided:
- Side wall: 42" long minimum, located 12" maximum from rear wall and extending 54" minimum from rear wall.
- Rear wall: 36" long minimum and extend from the centerline of the WC 12" minimum on side wall side and 24" minimum on open side.

## Water Fountain:

- Clear space: 30" x 48" centered in front of unit.
- Spout shall be 36" maximum O.F.F.
- Water flow shall provide a flow of water 4" high minimum.
- Spout shall be located 5" maximum from front of unit.

## Toilet Compartments:

- Clear space: 60" wide minimum perpendicular to side wall and 56" deep minimum for wall-hung or 59" deep minimum for floor-mounted WC.
- Door shall have ADA approved hardware and be self closing.
- Toe clearance shall be 9".





# Service Animals

- **Definition:** any dog that is individually trained to do work or perform tasks for the benefit of an individual with a disability, including a physical, sensory, psychiatric, intellectual, or other mental disability. The work or tasks performed by a service animal must be directly related to the individual's disability. The crime deterrent effects of an animal's presence or the provision of emotional support, well-being, comfort, or companionship do not constitute work or tasks and as such do not meet the definition of a service animal.
- **Inquiries:** to determine if an animal is a service animal, a public entity or private business may ask two questions:
  1. Is this animal required because of a disability?
  2. What work or task has this animal been trained to perform?

These inquiries may not be made if the need for the service animal is obvious (e.g. the dog is guiding an individual who is blind or is pulling a person's wheelchair). A public entity or private business may not ask about the nature or extent of an individual's disability. It also may not require documentation, such as proof that the animal has been certified, trained or licensed as a service animal, or require the animal to wear an identifying vest.

- **When and Where a Service Animal is Allowed Access:** individuals with disabilities shall be permitted to be accompanied by their service animals in all areas of public facilities and private business where members of the public are allowed. If an animal's presence compromises legitimate safety requirements that are necessary for safe operation, they can be excluded from a facility (e.g. a surgery or intensive care unit). An individual may be asked to remove a service animal from the premises if it not housebroken or is out of control.
- **Other Provisions:** a public entity or private business is not responsible for the care and supervision of a service animal. A public entity or private business shall not ask nor require an individual with a disability to pay a surcharge or deposit, even if people accompanied by pets are required to pay such fees. However; if individuals are normally charged for damages their pets cause, an individual may be charged for damage caused by their service animal.


