Message from the Chief



The information contained within this annual report is an accurate representation of the crimes and incidents reported to, and investigated by, the Watertown Police Department from January 1, 2016 through December 31, 2016. We want to thank the community of Watertown for your continued support and for all the partnerships we continue to develop. With your support and assistance we are able to effectively provide community based policing.

I encourage you to review this annual report to become informed on the activities of our police department. Towards the end of this document you will see a multi-year statistical comparison report. This report gives us historical data from several previous years. This really helps us to understand any increases or decreases in a particular area. We monitor these statistics monthly as the year progresses and address areas of concern promptly. I have highlighted a few areas below to bring your attention to some trends we are seeing.

In 2016 we responded to 21,825 calls for service. This is down 2% from 2015 and down 7% on the 5 year average.

Adult arrests, overall, were down slightly, 1% from 2015 and down 5% from the 5 year average. We saw a 6% decrease in arrest for possession of marijuana from 2015, however we saw a 15% increase in arrests for possession of a controlled substance, up 81% from the 5 year average. We also referred another 91 cases for the possession of a controlled substance to the State's Attorney. Methamphetamine has made a resurgence in Watertown and across the state of South Dakota. We are working closely in partnership with several entities to combat and reverse this trend through drug courts, public education, rehabilitation programs, and increased law enforcement efforts.

Juvenile arrest are down 26% from 2015 and down 17% from the 5 year average.

Traffic citations are up 23% from 2015 and 21% from the 5 year average. In 2016 we issued 1647 traffic citations and 2450 warnings citations. We attribute this increase to a federally funded traffic safety program we participate in that addresses speeding and seat belt usage. We are participating in this program to try to reduce the amount of accidents in Watertown. We continue to average 790 accidents a year. We are hoping to get this number below 700 through increased patrol and education.

As a department we strive to be as transparent as possible so that community members can see and know what we do. I want to thank the members of the police department for their hard work and dedication to community service.

WPD Command and Supervisory Staff


The WPD Chief of Police is the chief law enforcement officer in the City. The Chief's authority is derived through appointment by the Mayor by and with the approval of the City Council, and holds the office for the term of appointment unless sooner removed by the Mayor. All police officers are under the control of the Mayor and Chief and are subject to their order. The WPD command staff consists of the Chief of Police, Assistant Chief of Police, Reserve Chief of Police and three Captains who oversee three divisions; Special Operations, Support Services, and Professional Standards. Additional supervisory staff includes five Sergeants, four of whom supervise patrol squads, and the fifth supervises detectives.

WPD Organizational Chart

The WPD consists of a formal organizational structure with clearly defined components so that the chain of command and functional divisions are clearly understood by all personnel. It is necessary that all personnel be sufficiently familiar with the structure, functions, activities, and services associated with the operation of the WPD in order to assist citizens of, and visitors to, the City of Watertown by ensuring that their inquiries or problems are referred to the proper organizational component.
