Did you know?



Water and other materials that enter the storm sewer system are not treated before being discharged to area lakes, rivers, and streams.

10 Things *You* Can Do To Prevent Storm Water Pollution



1. Use fertilizers sparingly and sweep up driveways, sidewalks, and roads
2. Never dump anything down storm drains
3. Vegetate bare spots in your yard



10 Things *You* Can Do To Prevent Storm Water Pollution

Don't do what is shown below!!!!



Properly dispose of yard waste

4. Reduce the use of pesticides, avoid if possible

5. Direct downspouts away from hard surfaces

10 Things *You* Can Do To Prevent Storm Water Pollution

6. Repair car leaks and properly dispose of used motor oil



7. Wash your car at the car wash, or on your grass instead of on your driveway

10 Things *You* Can Do To Prevent Storm Water Pollution



8. Pick up after your pet

9. Sweep your driveway instead of hosing it off

10. Participate in spring city-wide cleanup and fall leaf program




